Who is the Data controller?

What personal information does the organisation collect and what lawful reasons do we have to collect and process it?

Type of data	What lawful reason do we have to collect and process it?
Name, personal details	We need these details in order to carry out our contract or task as you have requested. Information such as gender and ethnicity may be collected in order to meet legal obligations regarding equality
Educational and employment history, learning difficulties or disabilities	We need these details in order carry out our public task, to give you the best possible advice to assist you to apply for the right jobs or courses.

Why do we collect personal information?

It is the basic minimum required in order to carry out our contract, and to carry out our public task in providing careers advice.

Special Category Data and Convictions

We collect this for reasons of public interest, as we are unable to provide you with the best possible careers advice without knowing sensitive information such as learning difficulties or disabilities. In the case of ethnicity, it is collected to meet equality obligations

Where do we obtain your personal data?

This will be supplied by yourself.

How and where do we store data?

Data will be stored securely on paper, or stored securely by electronic methods.

Who has access to data?

Your information may be shared internally, with any HoW staff who need the data to carry out their tasks.

Do we process data outside the EEA?

HoW College will not transfer your data to countries outside the European Economic Area.

How does the organisation protect data?

The organisation takes the security of your data seriously. The organisation has internal policies and controls in place to try to ensure that your data is not lost, accidentally destroyed, misused or disclosed, and is not accessed except by its employees in the performance of their duties. The Data Protection policy is available to view on our website, or can be obtained in a paper version by contacting our reception.

For how long does the organisation keep data?

All data collected will be deleted within a year if the client does not apply or enrol to the college. The client may request to have data deleted or anonymised earlier.

What rights do you have?

As a data subject, you have a number of rights. You can:

- access and obtain a copy of your data on request;
- require the organisation to change incorrect or incomplete data;

• require the organisation to delete or stop processing your data, for example where the data is no longer necessary for the stated purposes of processing

• object to the processing of your data where the organisation is relying on its legitimate interests as the legal ground for processing.

Who can I complain to?

If you believe that HoW College has not complied with your data protection rights, please contact the Data Protection Officer in the first instance. What if I do not provide personal data?

Failure to provide data required to meet lawful obligations (except where consent is required) will result in us not being able to accept your child in the nursery.
