MINI RECORDING

Background:

As part of the music course here at the Heart of Worcestershire College you will be learning how to run and operate a recording studio. A basic understanding of how to record and use software to do so will help you when the course gets started.

Tasks:

If you have access to a laptop that can record audio (e.g. laptop has a built in microphone or you can connect a microphone to the laptop) please follow these steps:

- For both mac and PC download the Audacity audio editor app (www.audacityteam. org/)
- 2. Create a new mono (one sound source) track from the menu at the top of the screen
- On the new track either record straight into Audacity or import from another device (file -> import -> Audio)
- **4.** Have a practice at recording some audio. This is a great chance to practice your favourite piece of music to perform

The aim here is to record more than one sound and combine them to create a multitrack recording. Use Audacity to build layers of your sound through creating new tracks and overdubbing or layering of sounds.

MUSIC PERFORMANCE

Background:

The music course is shared 50/50, meaning 50% of the course is practical music performance and 50% is technical studio and computer based recording. In order to prepare for the first term of the course, getting into the swing of music performance will help get you ready for the first term's assessments.

Tasks:

One of the greatest shows on the BBC is the BBC Radio 1 Live Lounge sessions. Here, musicians are allowed to be creative and are free to change a cover song into their own style or sound.

Using YouTube to upload your finished video, create a video that demonstrates your musical ability. This task is focused on the BBC Radio 1 live lounge ethos so try to rework a song, beat, groove or piece of music into a new or different style.

A great example of this is the cover of 'Bad Guy by Billie Eilish' performed and reworked by 'two door cinema club'. You can hear how they have changed the song to fit their own style.

Be brave and have a go! It can be as simple as taking a rock song and reworking it into an acoustic guitar song.

Using any images and fonts you like, design a poster that promotes the event, using the following information:


Venue: Spires Theatre Date: 10th March 2021 Time: Doors open 6.30pm Price: £2.50
