The cost of your studies is an important consideration for any prospective student, so to help you as you choose your course we have listed the tuition fees that are applicable for full and part time students entering College for the next academic year.

Tuition Fees

Course	Year 1 (2021/22)	Year 2 (2022/23)
HND/Foundation Degree courses - Full Time	1st year £8,000	2nd year £8,000
BA (Hons) Degree in Social Work - Full Time	1st year £8,650	2nd year £8,650
HND/Foundation Degree courses - Part Time	1st year £4,000	2nd year £4,000

You can choose to pay your fees in full, or you can apply for a tuition fee loan.

Student Finance

Help with the costs of Higher Education

If you are planning to go into higher education you may be able to apply for financial support from the government to help you cover the costs.

Student Loans from the Government

All eligible students can get help with tuition fees and living costs through Student Loans. There are two types of Student Loans per academic year:

- A tuition fee loan for fees to cover the cost of your tuition fees in full
- A maintenance loan to help with living expenses (how much you get depends on your household income)

Childcare Grant

If you have children under 15, or under 17 if they have special educational needs you may be eligible for help with your childcare costs from Student Finance England. Please see link below for further information. www.gov.uk/childcare-grant

Boost Awards

If your household income is under £25,000 and you're not receiving any additional funding i.e. NHS Social Work Bursary you may be eligible for a boost award. Boost application forms are available from all online by visiting our website **www.howcollege.ac.uk/studentlife/student-finance.** The closing date for applications is 8th October 2021. Payments are made at the end of November, January and May.

Hardship Funds

Hardship funds may be available for students struggling to pay course related costs or for a one off emergency which may prevent you from attending college. To receive support from the hardship fund you must have applied for the full Student Finance package available to you i.e. full maintenance loan. Support will not normally be provided from both Boost and Hardship. Hardship can also be provided towards DSA assessment costs.

Disabled Students Allowance

If you have a disability, you can apply for an allowance to help meet the extra course costs that arise from a direct result of a disability or specific learning difficulty.

Overseas Students

International fees will apply where students do not meet the definition of 'Home and EU' (namely that students have been ordinarily resident in the UK/EU for three years preceding the course start date). Please also note that we currently do not have a Tier 4 Licence so are unable to sponsor students to study in the UK.

Students who are nationals of EU (or EEA) countries who are already living in the UK before Brexit and the start of their course will be treated equally to UK residents while the UK remains part of the EU and during any agreed transition period. Depending on the terms in which the UK leaves the EU, the Government may provide additional advice on EU/EEA nationals post Brexit. However, it is not expected that funding rules will change mid-year.

Late Enrolments

Students joining a course late are subject to the full course fee.

When do I need to pay my tuition fees?

All tuition fees are payable on completion of an enrolment form unless you are entitled to an exemption. Fees may be paid by cash, credit or debit card, cheque or in instalments via our recurring card payments (RCP) system. Our Advice staff are available to discuss various payment methods prior to the start of your course. Tuition fees are payable each college year.

Please note you are liable for the full years tuition fees even if you withdraw from your course part way through the academic year.

Refunds

As stated in the terms and conditions on all enrolment forms, refunds are only issued in exceptional circumstances. To request a refund please complete a Tuition Fee Refund Request form available from our website webapps.howcollege.ac.uk/ RefundRequests/RefundRequest/ Create.
